Betreff

Einrichtung des „Lifebility - Young Ethics Ambassador“ Sandro Castellana Wettbewerbs und Preises als Projekt der europäischen Lions, der ab dem Geschäftsjahr 2027/2028 auf europäischer Ebene bei jedem Europa Forum verliehen werden soll.

Erläuterung

Der Wettbewerb zielt darauf ab, innovative Projekte („Projekte“) oder Entwurfsvorschläge für Systeme oder Lösungen („Ideen“) auszuzeichnen, die öffentliche oder private Gemeinschaftsdienste im Sinne der „Wirtschaftsethik“ „zu angemessenen Kosten“ verbessern, vereinfachen und nutzbar machen können. In jedem Jahr soll sich der Wettbewerb auf einen bestimmten Wirtschaftsbereich wie Gesundheit, Reisen, Produktion, Vertrieb usw. konzentrieren, um eine bessere Grundlage für den Vergleich zwischen den verschiedenen Projekten und Ideen der Kandidaten zu haben. Der Gewinner des Wettbewerbs erhält eine Urkunde und eine Plakette. Eine detaillierte Begründung und die Organisationsregeln des Wettbewerbs und Preises sind beigefügt.

APPENDIX 1: Detailed rationale and organization rules of the competition and award

NAMING: “Lifebility - Young Ethics Ambassador”. This is the full name to be used in the international competitions. Alternately, in national competitions one might choose either “Lifebility” or “Young Ethics Ambassador”.

LANGUAGE: English

BROAD OUTLINE OF THE WORKING GROUP’S MISSION

This service hinges upon three key words: business, ethics and young: (i) Business, because it is a concourse of business ideas; (ii) Ethics, because it is the Lions’ aim to strengthen a respectful and fair behaviour in business complying with the Lions’ code of ethics; (iii) Young, because the contestants’ age is between 18 and 35 years. Because of this frame the idea is to sow the seeds of good and healthy business blossoming in the future.

PURPOSE

The idea of a purpose-driven business is of paramount importance here and it is the springboard to triggering a change in the human behaviour of people doing business thus developing human and social capital. Behaviour change is key and sustainability will be the guideline of the service which, on top of it, will be free from any useless bureaucratic burden. Foster the culture of Schumpeter type innovation in order to make it clear that a clear factor of development is entrepreneurship.

To help European, African and Middle-Eastern countries develop an entrepreneurial culture.

MEANS

The huge know how of the Lions’ network, the cumulated knowledge available in companies, governmental authorities and universities. Liaise with relevant LCI and LCIF offices in the world in order to get the maximum out of our network.

MEMBERS

Each MD, single district or not districted area of the Constitutional area Europe is invited to appoint one representative. The District, MD or not districted area of the President shall have its representative in addition to the President. The President does not represent a country, but all of them.

BOARD AND REPRESENTATION

The working group “Lifebility – Young Ethics Ambassador” shall elect one President, up to three Vice Presidents and one Secretary (“Officer”). All officers shall come from different countries. The Board is to be elected by the WG members. The President or another officer appointed by the President has the representation of the working group “Lifebility – Young Ethics Ambassador”.

The term of the Board members will be three years. One re-election is possible. The first term starts on July 1, 2026.

Decisions are taken thru majority voting. In case of parity the President has the casting vote



BROAD OUTLINE OF THE “MECHANICS” OF THE SERVICE

Italy has already done this service for 16 years and it has been successful. The first edition was in 2009 immediately after the economic and financial crisis of 2008 which, in our opinion, had its roots in the lack of ethics.

This phase is made up by two additional building blocks: (a) setting up a jury to evaluate the projects; (b) setting-up the contest;

- A) setting-up a jury made-up of three jurors established by one representative of the host Multi-District, Single-District or not-districted area of the EuropaForum, one external university professor or equivalent and one representative of the working group “Lifebility-Young Ethics Ambassador”. This jury shall evaluate and select the winner of the competition; the presence of a notary is highly recommended);
- B) setting-up the contest. Each Multi-District, single district or not-districted area participating in the “Lifebility – Young Ethics Ambassador” Working Group has the right to nominate a candidate which will participate in the final run. MD, single district or not-districted areas can join forces and participate together, provided the cumulated membership does not exceed 2000 members as of 30 of June of the year previous to the year of the contest.

Each year, by December 31, the WG will select one or two themes (pharmaceutics, biotech, digitization, distribution, energy, environment, internet, health,) and the projects will be in these themes.

Projects will be at the seed or start-up phase, they are original (not copied) and must be imbued by a high degree of digitisation and innovation.

Every country can organize the process as it best fits with the country situation. Just to give an example this year (2026) in Italy the whole process started on January 22 and will end-up with our national congress (end of May) when all the prizes will be delivered. This edition in Italy is the 16th.

Whatever the choices of each MD, single- district or not-districted area the deadline for delivering the projects to the EuropaForum Committee is 11h59 PM of MAY 31 of the EF organizing country.

The winner has to be selected not later than JULY 15.

CANDIDATES

Eligible candidates are youngsters aged between 18 and 35 years.

The evaluation parameters of the projects are broadly framed hereunder:

Benefits for the community

Innovation

Feasibility of implementation

Economic feasibility

Digitization (use of AI)

Quality of the business plan

Age of participants. A lower age of the presenters will be given an advantage over similar projects.



MODULES AND ABSTRACT

The “Lifeability- Young Ethics Ambassador” Working Group will provide a module where the project will be presented. A key component of this module will be the abstract that will not contain confidential information, since the projects will be made available to the public. The ability to present the project in a clear and synthetic way will be highly appreciated
